However, due to the approval of Louisiana Constitutional Amendment #2 in November 2021 affecting State contracts, ("Tax. Legislation"), Entergy did not have adequate time

History of the Paper
 The Daily Iberian can trace its roots back to 1893, when it published its first issue on February 9 of that year. S.P. Watts was its first editor and in that first issue wrote, "It will be our endeavor to give a faithful chronology of the daily happenings of the city of New Iberia, the land known as the Attakapas, and the general news of the whole country."

In the first issues that February, Watts wrote several editorials about the need to improve roads in the area around New Iberia, ... on the road leading to St. Martinville is a mud hole that is impassable, persons coming to the place, must of necessity turn to seek another road to town. This should not be allowed to remain there."

Local news and commentaries on local issues continue to be the focus of The Daily Iberian, still including issues with area roads, news about local residents, local government and more.

The paper underwent many changes over the years, ceased publication several times, became a weekly for various periods and switched locations of its business offices five times, now resting just a few blocks down Main Street from its initial offices in the Old Opera House downtown that no longer stands.

Early issues were printed alongside handbills and programs for the vaudeville and minstrel shows that made up most of the Opera House fare.

In 2019 the newspaper moved from the location it occupied for 56 years to the current location in downtown historic New Iberia. The structure was originally organized in 1897 by J. Paul Suberbielle and others as the old State Bank of New Iberia. It was later reorganized to become State National Bank. In the 1970s, the building was demolished and replaced with the structure as it stands today. The Main Street location positions The Daily Iberian at the very heart of the community which it serves.

STUDENT DRESS CODE

School board unanimously passes dress code changes

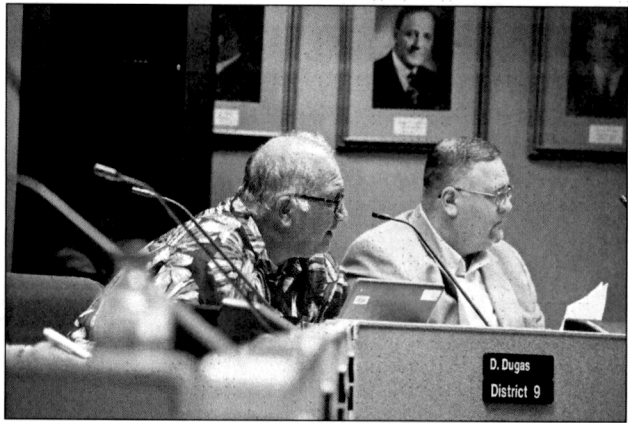
The Iberia Parish School Board approved six changes to the student dress code policy during their February 2 meeting.

The changes included adding red and gray shirts to the list of approved colors; removing the word "solid" from the description of approved jackets and sweatshirts, and adding red and gray to the list of approved colors; allowing denim jackets; allowing beards as long as they are "neatly groomed;" allowing rivets and outside pockets on uniform pants; and adding black to the color options for pants, shorts, and skirts.

The changes were unanimously supported by the dress code committee as well as the Principal Advisory Committee. The motion passed unanimously by the board.

The board also heard from representatives from Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Louisiana regarding employee medical insurance issues. Many employees reported problems with their insurance following a policy change, especially with prescription drug coverage. The board was told that the new policy should reduce the cost of prescription medication for most employees by reducing the prescription tiers from 5 to 3.

The board also discussed the sale of surplus buildings in New Iberia and Loreauville. The board was advised that, despite interest by the City of New Iberia, no property could

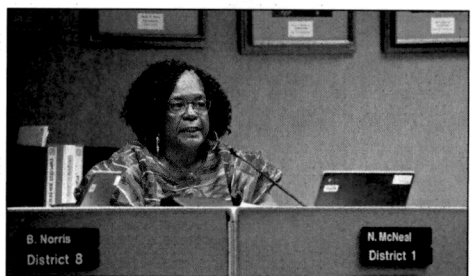


District 9 school board representative Dana Dugas, left, proposes a third color option for pants.

be donated to the city without a constitutional amendment being passed first. The board agreed to go ahead with the attempts to sell the building first before attempting to hold an election.

Nurse McNeal spoke to the board regarding the recognition of Black History Month for 2022. McNeal said that Black History Month is important because it reminds everyone of the hard work and sacrifices made by African Americans.

"We definitely need to recognize that African Americans have made great contributions to the country," said McNeal. "The kids in school definitely need to know their heritage and the things that have been accomplished

by their ancestors. Of course there is social media and YouTube, but it is very important that they learn this in school also."

The board opened the discussion to hear any comments from

the public, and a suggestion was made by one woman in attendance to try to create a Native American history month as well. Native American Heritage Month already exists, and is held in

He presented an additional option for the package for property. You now have 1% deductible with minimum of \$10,000. Allied is offering a 3% deductible with minimum of \$25,000. It brings your premium down \$2,900. He said he recommends you do not take this because of the value of our buildings. On auto the challenge is we have an open claim of \$175,000. We also had a claim that closed out recently for \$83,000. The district's claim experience is really good but with an open claim it makes the premium increase. We have one option to consider. At this time, we do not have a deductible for auto. They are offering a \$5,000 liability deductible and increase on the coverage of the vehicles. This drops the premium by \$10,000. He said we could consider this option, but we may use the \$10,000 savings with just two claims. Mr. Tyson said he felt we need to leave the auto coverage the same because of the average number of claims. The umbrella coverage increases only because auto increased. Public official's liability went down slightly. The cyber policy is with Travelers and it requires a multifactor authentication. He said we may want to consider this in the future. Mr. Caro said he found a company that does not require this, but by next year we may have to comply. The total for this premium would be \$178,518.07.

Moreover, Biden merely threatened sanctions and explicitly took military force off the table when it comes to Ukraine, stating, "We have no intention of putting American forces or NATO forces in Ukraine. But we—as I said, there are going to be serious economic consequences if he moves."

Meaning, Biden hasn't made a show of force to defend Ukraine. Then why'd he ring the invasion bell?

Will Biden next publicly present China's plans to invade Taiwan, only to later suggest that the U.S. means to only apply minimal sanctions, or impose more tariffs on imported goods if they do happen to invade?

Ukraine might have been better off with Russia knowing if we were willing to go to war over Ukraine. Biden said no.

Weakness is provocative.

Certainly, the troop movements, said to total about 100,000 troops on Russia's borders with Ukraine and Belarus, appear real enough, but the lack of intelligence on Putin's strategic intent could be what's giving the Ukrainians pause in talking up the invasion threat. But it could be more bark than bite.

The general health, psychological and economic toll of this virus on the United States and the world has been incalculable. There is no value that can be placed on the loss of priceless human life, but there is an assessment of the tremendous economic costs.

In just the first year of the pandemic, it was estimated that the virus led to an economic loss of approximately \$16 trillion.

Enough is enough, it is time we followed the lead of the good

citizens of Denmark who are ending all virus restrictions. At the very least, we need to find inspiration from citizens worldwide who are fighting back in Europe have been massive and are growing. The Canadian truckers "freedom convoy" was labeled a "fringe minority" by the progressive fool of a Prime Minister. However, it was such an amazing success that Ottawa was shut down and the Prime Minister was forced to flee the city.

Elsewhere, there is real pressure on Berlin over the pipeline. Maybe the threat of war helps, even imagined. Readers should recall that Germany has been a party with France in the Minsk peace talks between Russia and Ukraine since 2014 when the civil war there began after the U.S. helped push former Ukrainian president Viktor Yanukovich out of power to get a European Union trade deal ratified - Biden wrote about it in his book - and Russia annexed Crimea. If Berlin were to kill the pipeline, it could undercut its present role as a mediator in deescalating the conflict.

Moreover, Germany has committed itself to reducing the country's carbon footprint. Coal has gone from 46 percent of Germany's electricity production in 2008 to just 26 percent in 2021. By 2038, plans call for all coal plants to be eliminated. Now they will need more natural gas to offset their coal and nuclear electricity plant closures. That's an important point, because transitioning from coal to natural gas is a policy preference shared by Biden and his Democratic predecessor former President Barack Obama.

On Ukraine, Biden clearly miscalculated going public with the invasion talk without the prospective ally, Ukraine, on board. Now he's warned of an imminent invasion and needs Putin to deliver the war so that the U.S. doesn't look foolish. If we're wrong about the invasion, will Ukraine be more or less inclined to listen to U.S. intelligence in the future? And then there's

But Biden's global climate ambitions might not work without at least some Russian gas in the mix. That may be why the Biden administration green lit the pipeline and waived sanctions on it in May 2021. It knows Germany needs gas to go green.

So, perhaps we're trying to leverage Moscow on Nord Stream 2. Again, Biden initially greenlit the project but then appears to have had Germany do a 180 and delay final approval.

There are certainly winners and losers depending on what happens if sanctions are lowered. The threat of war could keep sanctions up and kill the pipeline. Is that what's happening here?

Two keys to watch are both Ukraine and Germany.

Which might be why the pipeline ultimately gets approved and perhaps also why there won't be another invasion of Ukraine. Now the Germans think the gas will be cheaper than war.

Germany, which still has a vested interest in importing more natural gas. It also values its role as a peacemaker between Russia and Ukraine.

On energy, the U.S. is already the largest supplier of natural gas to Europe in the world, but it's still not enough to offset Germany's need for Russian gas. For example, a planned liquefied natural gas terminal at the city of Brunsbuttel, a project former President Donald Trump was fond of as a potential alternative to Nord Stream 2, which originally was supposed to be done by 2022, may not get off the ground until 2025, if it happens at all, amid regulatory delays and a withdrawal of investor support, meaning, for the foreseeable future, Germany will depend on Russian gas from the Nord Stream pipelines.

"It's good for their health, it's good for the economy — pedestrians promote more shopping. If someone is walking from one place to another, they are far more likely to stop in at a store and support the rural economy."

Sharing resources is also a good way to provide space for exercise, Stroope said. Louisiana state policies promote shared use agreements within communities, such as a high school allowing the public to walk on its track during designated hours or a church allowing children to use a playground.

Stroope stressed that the primary goal of physical activity should be to improve overall health conditions and not weight loss. Physical activity can result in reduced weight but tying activity to weight loss can often lead to disappointment and abandoning the activity if weight loss doesn't occur quickly.

"We want to improve chronic health conditions, reduce the risk for heart disease and Type 2 diabetes."

"It's about improving blood pressure and cholesterol and improving sleep outcomes and cognitive outcomes for the entire lifespan," she said.

Who Gets Scammed: Why Some People Are More Vulnerable

The most dangerous attitude any consumer can have is what social scientists call the "illusion of invulnerability" — as in, "I'm too smart to ever fall for a con." No, you're not, and all the data show that everyone — irrespective of age, education, ethnicity, or gender — has the potential to be scammed, given the right circumstance and a scammer who's gifted at it, in the parlance of the profession, getting his mark "under the ether," in other words, unconscious of risk.

Moreover, the conventional thinking about victimhood is often wrong: When it comes to falling for scams, it's millennials, not seniors,

who are most vulnerable. Among those who reported losing money to fraud, those in their 20s accounted for 40 percent, the single largest group, vs. 18 percent for those 70 and older, according to 2017 Federal Trade Commission data.

However, older adults who fell victim to scams tended to lose larger amounts of money, compared with younger adults, the FTC found. Experts say losses by the elderly in financial fraud are not only attributable to age-related cognitive decline but also to the fact that the 65-plus generation controls trillions of dollars — and scammers follow the money.

Regardless of age, researchers have been able to identify certain characteristics that distinguish those who get taken in from those who don't. Doug Shadel, author of "Outsmarting the Scam Artists" (Wiley, 2012), says the following traits surface at far higher rates in non-victims.

Being Eager for Bargains

Do you know people who are always on the lookout for investment

"opportunities" and bargains, who send away for promotional materials and enter contests and drawings, and who open all their mail (electronic or postal), including sales brochures and generic charity come-ons? That kind of deep, regular exposure to what might broadly be called "the marketplace" makes one ripe to be a scam victim.

Susceptibility to Persuasion

Several studies conducted by Doug Shadel and his colleagues have found that fraud victims respond with greater interest than the general public to certain statements that con artists rely on to ensnare their prey: "This deal is only good for the next 24 hours," "My clients are earning 30 percent a year on this investment," or — a standby with veterans, a group that has become a new favorite target for scammers — "From one ex-marine to another..."

Lacking a Defensive Strategy

Scam victims tend to take fewer measures to prevent or minimize the possibility of fraud. They don't give themselves time after hearing

a sales pitch to think before making a buying decision, they neglect to do thorough professional reference checks, and fewer of them sign up for registries that limit unwanted phone calls.

Willingness to Take Risks

Researchers see a strong correlation between this trait and victimization, in part, they speculate, because high-risk but legitimate investment often have many outward similarities to fraudulent deals, such as the potential to get better-than-market returns and the need to make a snap decision. Thus, similar personality types are drawn to both.

Facing a Rough Patch

If you've lost a loved one, gone through a divorce, been laid off from a job, or otherwise experienced some sort of life trauma in the past two years, watch out. According to a 2012 Federal Trade Commission study, your odds of being scammed more than double — most likely because coping with difficult life circumstances takes up cognitive capacity that might otherwise be used to spot scams.

As such, ELL intends to supplement its Evaluation Report in April 2022 to include the effects of the Tax Legislation.

ELL's RSP filing for the TY 2021 Test Year reflects an Earned Return on Equity ("EROE") of 2.63% and pursuant to the terms of the RSP the EROE requires a rate adjustment by ELL. It is estimated that the rate increase will have the following effect on typical monthly customer bills: a Small General Service customer using 50 CCF will increase \$3.75, from \$419.66 to \$423.41; a General Service customer using 500 CCF will increase \$33.15, from \$419.66 to \$452.81; and a Large General Service customer using 10,000 CCF will increase \$346.08, from \$6,385.21

(February 7, 2022) - Average gasoline prices in Louisiana have risen 8.5 cents per gallon in the last week, averaging \$3.13/g today, according to GasBuddy's survey of 2,436 stations in Louisiana. Prices in Louisiana are 13.4 cents per gallon higher than a month ago and stand 95.6 cents per gallon higher than a year ago.

According to GasBuddy price reports, the cheapest station in Louisiana was priced at \$2.69/g yesterday while the most expensive was \$3.81/g, a difference of \$1.12/g. The lowest price in the state yesterday was \$2.69/g while the highest was \$3.81/g, a difference of \$1.12/g.

The national average price of gasoline has risen 8.0 cents per gallon in the last week, averaging \$3.42/g today. The national average is up 12.3 cents per gallon from a month ago and stands 97.5 cents per gallon higher than a year ago, according to GasBuddy data compiled from more than 11 million weekly price reports covering over 150,000 gas sta-

tions across the country.

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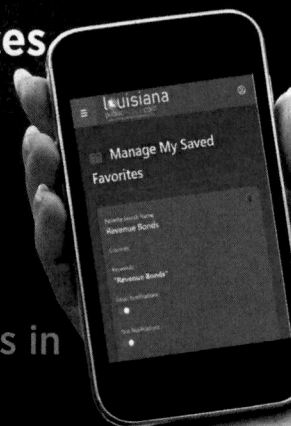

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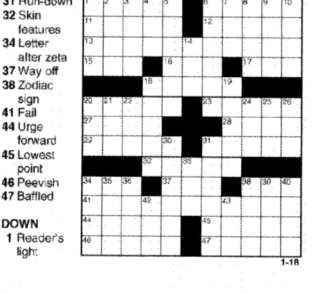
