ORDER NUMBER T-37796

LOUISIANA PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION VS. AD MOVERS, LLC.

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*Docket No. T-37796, In re: Alleged violation of La. R.S. 45:161 through 180.1, by engaging in activities related to moving household goods prior to complying with the requirements of La. R.S. 45:164 (E) and General Order dated March 16, 2021 and for failure to comply with the requirements of General Order dated April 3, 2008 as amended.*

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(Decided at the March 18, 2026 Business and Executive Session.)

## ORDER

### **I. Background**

In response to a complaint, the Louisiana Public Service Commission (“LPSC” or “Commission”) Staff opened an investigation into AD Movers, LLC, (“AD Movers” or “Carrier”) and its business activities. As a result of this investigation, Staff found evidence that AD Movers had violated La. R.S. 45:161 through 180.1, by engaging in activities related to moving household goods prior to complying with the requirements of La. R.S. 45:164 (E) and General Order dated March 16, 2021, and for failure to comply with the requirements of General Order dated April 3, 2008, as amended. Staff subsequently issued a citation to AD Movers in the present docket.

### **II. Jurisdiction**

The Commission exercises jurisdiction over common carriers and public utilities in Louisiana pursuant to Article IV, Section 21(B) of the Louisiana Constitution, which states:

“The commission shall regulate all common carriers and public utilities and have such other regulatory authority as provided by law. It shall adopt and enforce reasonable rules, regulations, and procedures necessary for the discharge of its duties, and shall have other powers and perform other duties as provided by law.”

Pursuant to this authority, the Commission has issued General Order dated March 16, 2021, which provides for the requirements a household goods carrier must satisfy to operate within the State of Louisiana, and General Order dated April 3, 2008, as amended, which requires that all household goods carriers operating intrastate in Louisiana must include their legal and/or registered name and physical address in all advertising.

Further, LA. R.S. 45:164(E) provides that “[a]ll intrastate movers of household goods shall be required to apply for and secure a common carrier certificate from the Louisiana Public Service Commission ... prior to engaging in any activities related to moving household goods.”

### **III. Stipulation**

In response to the citation, Hernan A. Pineda, owner of the Carrier, executed an Affidavit and Stipulation on behalf of the Carrier admitting to violating all violations within the citation. In the Affidavit and Stipulation, Mr. Pineda agreed to the imposition of a \$1,000.00 fine and a \$25.00 citation fee with \$500.00 of the fine suspended conditioned on the following conditions:

1. Execute this Affidavit and Stipulation before a notary and return to LPSC Transportation Staff by March 5, 2026;
2. Cease engaging in activities related to moving household goods in any type of trucks regardless if they are company owned or company leased, and including the advertising for such services until such time as a Common Carrier Certificate is issued to AD Movers, LLC;
3. AD Movers, LLC agrees to remove all references of moving services and change the language to read “labor only services” on the website <https://admoversla.com/>;
4. AD Movers, LLC agrees to pay the fine in three monthly payments as follows:
  - Executed Affidavit and Stipulation with first payment of \$193.00 due March 5, 2026;
  - Second payment of \$166.00 due April 5, 2026;
  - Final payment of \$166.00 due May 5, 2026;

Failure to comply with any of the above requirements will result in the \$500.00 suspended portion of the fine becoming due immediately.

**IV. Commission Action**

This matter was considered at the Commission’s March 18, 2026 Business and Executive Session. On motion of Chairman Skrmetta, seconded by Commissioner Lewis, and unanimously adopted, the Commission voted to assert its original and primary jurisdiction and take the matter up pursuant to Rule 57.

On motion of Chairman Skrmetta, seconded by Vice Chairman Coussan, and unanimously adopted, the Commission voted to accept the Affidavit and Stipulation executed on March 4, 2026 for fines and fees totaling \$525.00.

**IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:**

1. The Affidavit and Stipulation executed on March 4, 2026, for fines and fees totaling \$525.00 is accepted; and,
2. This Order is effective immediately.
