("NELPCO"), through undersigned counsel, which respectfully requests the Louisiana Public Service Commission ("LPSC" or "Commission"), pursuant to Section 301(E) of the Louisiana Public Services Commission's Regulations for Competition in the Local Telecommunications Market, to grant Volt a Certificate of Authority to operate as an interconnected Voice over Internet Protocol ("VoIP") provider and Competitive Local Exchange Carrier ("CLEC") statewide in Louisiana.

7. Financial, Managerial, and Technical Qualifications

(a) Financial Qualifications

To demonstrate its financial qualifications, Applicant submits the most recent financial

statements of NELPCO, Applicant's parent company, as Confidential Attachment C.

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Applicant's parent NELPCO intends to borrow funds to construct the broadband system

regarding which this application is being submitted. See Docket Order No. S-35745 for the Staff

Order of Non-Opposition to NELPCO's Financing Plan.

(b) Managerial and Technical Qualifications

Volt plans to partner with the National Rural Telecommunications Cooperative

("NRTC"), an association representing more than 1.500 rural utilities, in connection with its

provision of telecommunications services. NRTC will support Volt's managerial and technical

ability in providing telecommunication services. NRTC has assisted dozens of rural electric

cooperatives in the design, construction and operation of broadband systems and the associated

voice services provided to their customers. NRTC partners with various companies to assist in

operating telecommunications systems, including Alianza, which is the company Volt plans to

engage through NRTC.

Volt currently has its Application for Eligible Telecommunications Carrier designation

pending before the Commission (Docket No. S-35847). Volt has no other Certificate of Public

Convenience and Necessity ("CCN") or other applications pending in this or any other state.

engage and their relevant experience.

8. Description of the Proposed Services

As a winner in the 2020 Federal Communications Commission's ("FCC") Rural Digital

Opportunity Fund Phase 1 ("RDOF-1") Auction. NELPCO formed Volt for purposes of

designing, developing, and operating the broadband internet system must meet its public interest

obligation by offering broadband internet service, defined as a minimum of 25 megabits-per-

second ("Mbps") downstream and 3 Mbps upstream ("25/3"), through a combination of Fiber-to-

the-Home ("FTTH") and Fixed Wireless ("FWA") components, and standalone voice service to

all eligible locations in the census block groups which it won in the RDOF-1 Auction. Volt's

FWA would provide a minimum speed of 50 Mbps down / 5 Mbps up and a maximum speed of

100 Mbps down / 10 Mbps up. Volt would provide a minimum symmetric speed of 200 Mbps –

down and up – and a maximum symmetric speed of 1 gigabit (1000 Mbps) – down and up – over

the FTTH portion of the broadband system. 1 gigabit speed is the fastest available internet speed

at present.

Applicant will also provide its customers with voice grade access to the Public Switched

Telephone Network ("PSTN") through its provision of interconnected VoIP service. Applicant

seeks statewide authority to provide, and will be able to offer voice grade access to, the PSTN on

a statewide basis. Attachment E is a map of Applicant's initial proposed service area for

broadband and eligible telecommunication carrier services.

An illustrative tariff in compliance with the requirements in Section 401 of the

Commission's Regulations is attached as **Attachment F**. Applicant will be constructing a fiber

optic network, among other capital commitments, over which to provide broadband and VoIP

services on a resold basis. Therefore, Applicant will provide notice to the Commission once the

necessary network is complete and will provide any necessary revisions and an Effective Date

for the illustrative tariff at that time. Further, NELPCO is required to submit periodic reports and

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information to LPSC Staff regarding the construction plan, development and construction status regarding the broadband system pursuant to LPSC Order No. S-35745.

PRAYER

Wherefore, Volt Broadband, LLC respectfully prays that, pursuant to Section 301(E) of the Louisiana Public Service Commission's Regulations for Competition in the Local Telecommunications Market, the Louisiana Public Service Commission grant Volt Broadband, LLC a Certificate of Authority to operate as an interconnected Voice over Internet Protocol ("VoIP") provider and Competitive Local Exchange Carrier ("CLEC") statewide in Louisiana, and for all other relief available under the law and the facts.
