

**SELF-BUILD COMMERCIAL TEAM GUIDELINES AND
ACKNOWLEDGEMENT FOR THE 2024 ENTERGY LOUISIANA, LLC COMBINED
CYCLE COMBUSTION TURBINE RFP**

It is anticipated that you will be involved in formulating, preparing and submitting a proposal(s) as the Self-Build Option for consideration in Entergy Louisiana's Combined Cycle Combustion Turbine Request for Proposals For CCCT Resources ("2024 ELL CCCT RFP" or "RFP"), that will be issued on behalf of Entergy Louisiana, LLC ("ELL"). A Self-Build Option is defined as the construction of one or more Combined Cycle Combustion Turbine(s) based on specifications developed by Entergy Services, LLC's ("ESL") System Planning & Operations organization ("SPO"). The purpose of this document is to establish guidelines with which you must comply during the Term set forth in this document (see Section 6).

As a member of the group that will develop any Self-Build Option ("Self-Build Commercial Team"), you must acknowledge, by your signature below, that you will comply with the following restrictions and guidelines. Your participation on the Self-Build Commercial Team is conditioned upon compliance with all applicable terms of these guidelines. If, after executing this Acknowledgment, circumstances arise (e.g., change in job position) that indicate you are about to engage in activities contrary to the restrictions and guidelines listed below, then you must contact one of the ESL Legal Representatives identified in Section 7 of this document prior to engaging in such activities so that appropriate action can be taken. Please note that retail regulators of ELL and the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission ("FERC") may scrutinize any RFP process and may require ESL and/or ELL to show regulators that the affiliate conduct rules have been followed. A link to the FERC Standards of Conduct for Transmission Providers and the FERC Market-Based Rate Affiliate Restrictions will be posted on the ESL RFP web site and are available to you should you wish to consult them.

1. **Restrictions Regarding RFP Process.** In order to participate in the Self-Build Commercial Team, at all times during the term hereof you must act independently of SPO, ESL and ELL employees involved in the RFP process, including those formulating the RFP (including preparing the RFP documents) and evaluating the proposals received in response to the RFP from any bidder (affiliates, non-affiliated or Self-Build Option), provided that nothing herein shall restrict you from formulating and submitting a Self-Build Option on behalf of ELL.

(a) Other than your Self-Build Commercial Team activities, you shall not be involved with, or assist in any manner with, the RFP process. This includes (i) the decision-making process related to the issuing of the RFP (including preparing the RFP documents), (ii) the review of RFP bids submitted to ESL (acting on behalf of ELL) in response to the RFP, (iii) the decision-making, deliberation or analysis on behalf of ELL with regard to the evaluation or selection of any bid submitted in response to the RFP, and/or (iv) any negotiations on behalf of ELL of the terms and conditions of contracts resulting from the RFP process (other than negotiations on behalf of the Self-Build Commercial Team with ELL with respect to the Self-Build Option).

(b) You shall not receive or seek any non-public information from SPO or any ESL or ELL employees involved in the RFP process regarding the RFP or obtained as part of the RFP process that is not simultaneously shared with all actual or potential bidders into the RFP.

(c) Unless there is a clear and identified non-RFP related business need, and except as provided for in paragraph 1(d) below, you shall avoid interactions with employees supporting the RFP process. These guidelines do not apply to communications which are purely personal or unrelated to Entergy business activities.

(d) The Self-Build Commercial Team shall be required to use the same communication process regarding the RFP that is required to be used by all bidders and potential bidders into the RFP. In addition, all meetings related to the Self-Build Option between (i) the Self-Build Commercial Team members and (ii) employees involved in the formulation of the RFP or the evaluation, acceptance, rejection or negotiation of proposals received in response to the RFP, must be attended (in person or by telephone) by the RFP Independent Monitor ("IM"), or an ESL Legal representative, or one of their designated representatives, or ESL FERC Compliance or one of its designated representatives. The ESL Legal representative(s), the IM, and ESL FERC Compliance group will be given prior notice of such meetings. The ESL Legal

representatives for these guidelines are L. Richard Westerburg, Jr., Kristen Yates, Larry Hand, Kathryn Washington, and Sean Moore (or their designees).

(e) The RFP documents will disclose the requirements regarding submission of interconnection applications with the Midcontinent Independent System Operator, Inc. (“MISO”).

2. Restrictions Regarding Entergy Competitive Affiliates. The FERC Affiliate Restrictions require, as a condition of granting market-based rate authority to certain Entergy Competitive Affiliates, that the Entergy Operating Companies and the Entergy Competitive Affiliates operate separately to the maximum extent practicable and Entergy Operating Company market information not be shared with Competitive Affiliates unless simultaneously disclosed to the public. These Affiliate Restrictions requirements are codified by the FERC in 18 Code of Federal Regulations (“CFR”) §35.39¹. State and local codes of conduct applicable to the Included Operating Companies likewise contain similar restrictions.

In order to participate in the Self-Build Commercial Team, at all times you must operate separately to the maximum extent practicable from Entergy Competitive Affiliates² (and their employees³) that may be participating in the preparation or consideration of bid proposals for this RFP, including employees formulating a proposal in response to the RFP on behalf of an Entergy Competitive Affiliate. To operate separately from Entergy Competitive Affiliates (and their employees), you must not be involved in performing the following activities on behalf of any Competitive Affiliate:

(a) You must not be involved with, or assist in any manner in, (i) the decision-making process for any Entergy Competitive Affiliate with regard to the submission of proposals in response to the RFP, (ii) the development/approval by the Entergy Competitive Affiliate of the actual proposal to the RFP, or (iii) any negotiations on behalf of any Entergy Competitive Affiliate of the terms and conditions of contracts resulting from the RFP process.

(b) You shall not participate in the Marketing Function⁴ of any Entergy Competitive Affiliate.

3. Compliance with Standards of Conduct. In order to participate in the Self-Build Commercial Team, you must comply with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (“FERC”) Standards of Conduct for Transmission Providers. The FERC Standards of Conduct mandate that the Transmission Organization of the Entergy Operating Companies must function independently from the Marketing Function and that personnel cannot inappropriately

² “Entergy Competitive Affiliates” refers to Entergy Power, LLC; EWO Marketing, LLC; EAM Nelson Holding, LLC; and RS Cogen, LLC; Entergy Nuclear Palisades LLC; Entergy Nuclear Indian Point 2, LLC; Entergy Nuclear Indian Point 3, LLC; Entergy Nuclear Power Marketing, LLC, as well as service company personnel who perform any market or generation function on behalf of these affiliates.

⁴ The “Marketing Function” refers to employees, contractors, consultants, or agents that actively and personally engage on a day-to-day basis in the sale for resale, or offers for sale, in interstate commerce of electric service or capacity, demand response, virtual transactions, or financial or physical transmission rights.

convey Transmission Function Information⁵ to Marketing Function employees of the Entergy Operating Companies or Entergy Competitive Affiliates.

4. **Restrictions Regarding Other Utility Operations.** You may perform your normal job function outside the Self-Build Commercial Team, provided however, you (a) shall not participate in the Marketing Function on behalf of any Entergy Operating Company and (b) shall not participate in the Transmission Function⁶ on behalf of the Entergy transmission system.

5. **Support Services.** The members of the Self-Build Commercial Team may seek the assistance of non-team members to provide support services. Any individual that provides support services to the Self-Build Commercial Team must first sign the “Support Services for the Self-Build Commercial Team Guidelines.”

6. **Term.** These guidelines commence as of the date signed below and continue to apply during the duration of your involvement in the Self-Build Commercial Team. Once the final RFP selections are made, these guidelines no longer apply regarding the Self-Build Option. Please note that the FERC Standards of Conduct for Transmission Providers and the FERC Affiliate Restrictions remain in effect after the RFP.

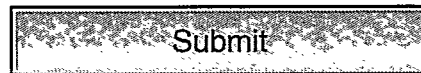
