ASCENSION PARISH GOVERNMENT'S NOTICE OF INTERVENTION, OBJECTION TO CONSIDERATION OF INCOMPLETE APPLICATION, EXCEPTION OF PREMATURITY AND INCLUSION ON SERVICE LIST

NOW COMES, through undersigned counsel, the Ascension Parish Government ("Parish") pursuant to Rules 10 and 19 of the Louisiana Public Service Commission ("LPSC" or "Commission") Rules of Practice and Procedure, which hereby intervenes in this proceeding, objects to Dixie Electric Membership Corporation's ("DEMCO") Application For Rate Rider to Recover Costs Associated with Move Ascension Road Projects ("Application"), and excepts to the prematurity of the Application as follows:

1.

This proceeding was initiated by DEMCO which filed its Application seeking a rate rider for uncertain costs that may be incurred by DEMCO for relocating certain electric utility facilities in conjunction with Parish road improvement projects. Notice of DEMCO's filing was published in the LPSC's Official Bulletin Number 1330, dated August 16, 2024.

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2.

The Parish is a political subdivision of the State of Louisiana.

3.

Rule 10 provides that "[a]ny party actually in interest may appear in any proceeding before the [LPSC]."

4.

Rule 10 further provides that "any...political subdivision [of the State of Louisiana] ... shall be permitted to appear in any proceeding whether as a formal intervenor or otherwise, and present any relevant and proper testimony and evidence bearing upon the issues involved in the particular proceeding."

OBJECTION TO CONSIDERATION OF DEMCO'S APPLICATION

5.

Rules 13(A) – (D) discuss the general requirements for the form and content of pleadings filed before the Commission. In addition to the general requirements therein, Rule 13(E) provides as follows:

In addition to the other requirements contained in the Rule, if the pleadings, application or petition seeks an increase in rates or tariffs, it shall not be considered effectively filed unless it shall have appended thereto all of the sworn testimony, affidavits, and exhibits upon which the company will rely in support of its request for additional revenue together with a proposed schedule of rates or tariffs designated to produce the additional revenue requested.

Rule 13(E) (emphasis added).

6.

DEMCO's application seeks an increase in rates via a rate rider for costs that is speculates that it may incur in the future. In support of its Application, DEMCO attaches as Exhibit A the July 31, 2024, Testimony of Randall C. Pierce. Section VI of Mr. Pierce's testimony is titled "Rider

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Amount" wherein Mr. Pierce surmises on costs that may be incurred by DEMCO in relocating its facilities. However, Mr. Pierce's "testimony" is not "a proposed schedule of the rates or tariffs designated to produce the additional revenue requested" as required by Rule 13(E).

7.

A schedule of rates is a necessary component in an application for rate increase so that it can be determined whether the rate increase would be "reasonable and just." *Gulf States Utilities Co. v. Louisiana Public Service Commission*, 62 So.2d 250, 252 (La. 1952). Because DEMCO failed to include a schedule of rates as required by Rule 13(E), it is impossible to determine whether the proposed rate of \$5.55 per member is "reasonable and just." Additionally, any application that fails to include a proposed schedule of rates "shall not be considered effectively filed." Rule 13(E). Accordingly, DEMCO's application should be rejected for failure to comply with Rule 13(E).

DILATORY EXCEPTION OF PREMATURITY

8.

The dilatory exception of prematurity "questions whether the cause of action has matured to the point that it is ripe for judicial determination." Williamson v. Hospital Serv. Dist. No. 1 of Jefferson, 2004-0451, p. 4 (La. 12/1/04), 888 So.2d 782, 785. A suit is premature when it is brought before the right to enforce it has accrued. Jefferson Door Co., Inc., v. Cragmar Const., L.L.C., p. 3 (La. App. 4 Cir. 1/25/12), 81 So.3d 1001, 1004.

9.

On or about August 22, 2022, DEMCO filed suit against the Parish and HNTB Corporation in the 23rd Judicial District Court ("23rd JDC Suit"). DEMCO's suit seeks, in part, a declaratory judgment that declares that the "Franchise [Agreement for Ascension Parish] does not obligate DEMCO to relocate its utility lines to accommodate road improvements to Parish roads at the

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request of the Parish." The 23rd JDC Suit is currently pending and, as such, the financial responsibility of relocating DEMCO's facilities has not been judicially determined. Accordingly, it is impossible in this rate case to determine whether the rate would be "reasonable and just." *Gulf States Utilities Co. v. Louisiana Public Service Commission*, 62 So.2d 250 (La. 1952). Therefore, this Commission should respectfully grant the Parish's exception of prematurity and dismiss DEMCO's Application.
