ORDER NUMBER U-37131

ENTERGY LOUISIANA, LLC, EX PARTE.

Docket No. U-37131, In re: Request for certification of the construction of the Bayou Power Station, including cost recovery.

(Decided November 3, 2025.)

ORDER OF DISMISSAL

On March 5, 2024, Entergy Louisiana, LLC (“ELL”) filed an application with the Louisiana Public Service Commission (“Commission”) seeking approval and certification of construction of the Bayou Power Station. Notice of the proceeding was published in the Commission’s *Official Bulletin* on March 15, 2024. Timely interventions were filed by the Alliance for Affordable Energy (“AAE”), the Louisiana Energy Users Group (“LEUG”), the Southern Renewable Energy Association (“SREA”), and Sierra Club. On April 11, 2024, a Notice of Assignment and Notice of Status Conference was issued, noticing a status conference. Thereafter, at the unopposed request of Commission Staff, the status conference was rescheduled. At a status conference held on May 29, 2024, a procedural schedule was established. On September 10, 2024, at the unopposed request of Commission Staff, the procedural schedule was modified. On September 18, 2024, Commission Staff, AAE and LEUG each filed direct testimonies. On October 4, 2024, at the unopposed request of ELL, the remaining procedural schedule was continued without date. On October 28, 2025, ELL filed a Motion to Dismiss Without Prejudice. The motion informed LEUG had not expressed a position on the motion. Subsequently, a Notice of Opportunity to Respond was issued, notifying LEUG it had until October 31, 2025 to file a position on the motion. No positions were filed by LEUG in response to the notice.

This dismissal is prepared in accordance with Rule 56(d) of the Rules of Practice and Procedure of the Commission, which provides:

Except at the discretion of the administrative law judge, the procedures contained within subpart (a) of this Rule shall not apply to a motion to dismiss jointly filed by all parties of record, a motion to dismiss with prejudice filed by the party who instituted the proceeding, or a motion to dismiss without prejudice filed by a party who instituted the proceeding but prior to the filing of any other party’s filing of a responsive pleading. Upon the filing of such a motion to dismiss, the administrative law judge may forego all recommendation procedures and prepare an appropriate order of dismissal for issuance by the Commission.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

That Docket Number U-37131 be, and hereby is, DISMISSED without prejudice.
